PART C - SUMMARY OF CLAIM (Officer's Notes - Verbatim Where Possible)

Applicant states she is a member of the People's Democratic Salvation Front (PDSF), an opposition political party active in Rivers State, Nigeria. She attended a PDSF protest on 14 [REDACTED] 2026 in Ahoada town.

On the evening of 14 [REDACTED] 2026 [NB: applicant appears uncertain of the exact date - to be clarified at substantive interview], applicant states that officers of the Rivers State Security Service (RSSS) came to her family home. She states that her brother, Chidi Ok [REDACTED] was detained and beaten in her presence by officers acting on the orders of Commissioner Victor Adeyemi of Rivers State - described as a senior political figure opposed to the PDSF.

Applicant states she fled through a neighbour's home as officers searched the property. She was assisted by a person she identifies only as 'a church contact' who arranged travel documents and transport.

She does not know her brother's current whereabouts. She states she fears detention, serious harm, and possible death if returned to Nigeria. She states she cannot seek protection from Nigerian authorities as the threat originates from state actors.

Applicant has a cousin in Manchester (name and contact not taken at this stage). No other family in the UK.

Applicant appeared distressed throughout the interview. A break was taken at approximately 35 minutes. Medically fit to continue per HO medical screening note. Visible physical marks observed on forearm and upper back - see Part D.
